Enter and travel the county through two I-77 passages: Belle Valley Exit 28 and Caldwell Exit 25, which offer easy access to a world of scenic back roads and friendly people.

Enjoy the rustic beauty of southern Ohio while traveling along the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. The 105-mile byway begins on SR-78 at Clarington, OH, crosses through Monroe Co. into Noble County & continues along SR-78 into Morgan Co. ending in Nelsonville, OH, Athens County.





The Historic Jail, designed by J.W. Yost of Columbus and built by Mills & Summers of Caldwell in 1881-1882, replaced the first jail that had been built on this site in 1859. It served as a jail and home for the sheriff and his family from 1882 to 1998. The Historical Society leased the structure in 1999. The building was dedicated as a museum July 4, 2003 and was added to the National Registry in 2004.

Historic 1832 home set on 13 acres and built by the early settler who donated the land for various county buildings and for whom Caldwell is named. Now owned by the Noble Co. Historical Society. A venue for teas, weddings, musical events. Every year, the Historical Society decorates the home for Christmas and hosts a holiday open house. A historic marker was recently erected at the home. Tours available through the Noble Co. Info. Center.

Big Muskie Bucket and Miners' Memorial Park

Located 17.5 miles west of Caldwell on St. Rt. 78 (just past the intersection with St. Rt. 83) in AEP's reclaimed ReCreation Land.

The Big Muskie was the largest dragline ever built – one of the Seven Engineering Wonders of the World. Its 220-cubic -yard bucket is the park's main attraction. An information center explains mining procedures, and there's a pleasant picnic area. Closed November through April.

Four historic structures grace this area shaded by oak trees: the Dimmerling-Foraker Covered Bridge, Walters Log Cabin, Crooked Tree School, and Bethel Primitive Baptist Church. The buildings date from the 1800s and were previously located in other parts of the county, disassembled and rebuilt in Heritage Park.

Johnny Appleseed Chapman and his family lived near here, and he planted his fruit trees in the area. The Memorial is made of rocks donated by people all along his route. Relatives are buried in the family cemetery on a nearby hill. (not John Chapman)

The church is on the National Register of Historic Places due to both its history as a parish organized by early German immigrants (1847) and its impressive Romanesque Revival architecture. Still actively in use for worship. Hosts an annual pork and sauerkraut dinner you will enjoy!

East of Caldwell along St. Rt. 78. www.roadsideamerica.com/story/11665. I-77 exit 25. Hwy 78 east of town. At the jct of Hwy 564, in a little park on the southeast corner. Look for the caboose. Park and walk into the trees, paralleling Hwy 78. You'll quickly find the well.

In 1814, Silas Thorla and Robert McKee were drilling for salt. It was a disappointment when they struck oil although they collected the oil and sold it as a salve and digestive aid called Seneca Oil. Turned out this well was the first oil well in North America and foretold the future of Noble County's involvement in the energy industry. The original well was cased with a hollow sycamore log, which can still be seen, and the well still produces limited quantities of oil, gas and salt water. Caboose #33 from the Bellaire, Zanesville, Cincinnati Railroad (affectionately known as Bent, Zig-zag and Crooked) is housed here. This railroad used narrow gauge track - good for winding through the southern Ohio hills.



Improvements were made to the well site this past year by the **Ohio Natural Energy Institute** in Granville, Ohio.

Celebrating the Life of the US NAVY USS SHENANDOAH **Rigid Airship**



- The ZR-1 was the first of 4 U.S. rigid airships built in America.
- It was assembled in U.S. Naval Hanger #1 in Lakehurst, New Jersey.
- The Naval ZR-1 was 1st rigid airship to use helium rather than the highly flammable hydrogen.
- Christened U.S.S. Shenandoah on Oct. 10, 1923. Shenandoah means "Daughter of the Stars" in Native American language.
- On Sept. 2, 1925, U.S.S. Shenandoah began its' 57th flight, a U.S. Naval tour that was to include 11 states and 40 cities in six days.
- A severe thunderstorm in the early morning on Sept. 3, 1925, caused the U.S.S. Shenandoah to crash.
- 14 of the 43 members of the U.S.S. Shenandoah died in the crash.
- Memorial markers in Buffalo township, Noble Twp, and Sharon Twp, in **Noble County.**

On September 3, 1925, the USS Shenandoah, a zeppelin built for the U.S. Navy, crashed near Ava while on a publicity tour of County Fairs. Fourteen crew members lost their lives. There's a memorial in Ava located a couple of lots north of the Methodist Church. Memorabilia related to the crash is housed at the Jail Museum and in a museum/trailer in Ava, which is open by appointment. 



The Hunt for the Hundred Scavenger Hunt is a collaboration between the Noble County CVB ,The Noble County Historical Society and the business community to honor the 100th anniversary of the crash of the USS Shenandoah. The airship crashed during a thunderstorm on September 3, 1925.

Businesses across Noble County have a 24x8 metal sign of the USS Shenandoah on display along with a card and 3 digit code. To play the "Hunt for the Hundred" collect a trifold at various local businesses, such as the Journal Leader, put the codes in the boxes beside the business names, complete the entry blank inside and send the trifold in (anytime throughout the year) by Nov 1st, 2025. You will then be entered into drawings for cash prizes. You do not have to find them all, but the more you find the more cash you could be entered in to win.

The first commercial radio station in the U.S. started broadcasting in 1920. A pioneer was Cincinnati inventor and entrepreneur Powel Crosley Jr. When his son asked for a radio in 1921, Crosley was surprised to find that toy radios cost \$100+. He hired 2 University of Cincinnati students to design a low-cost version, and later that year introduced the "Harko" at a sales price of \$7. By 1925, the Crosley Radio Corp. was the largest radio manufacturer in the world, and by the end of the decade, more than 12 million homes had radios. No other invention at the time did more to spread music, sports, advertising, and ideas throughout the country.






